INVOCATION PRAYER (standing)

Blessed be the Holy Trinity, +
God, the most high Creator,
Christ, our crucified and risen Savior,
Holy Spirit, whose breath renews the face of the earth. **Amen.**

Let us pray,

Holy God, in you we live and move and have our being. You give us this earth we call home. When and where we falter and fail in our care, when and where we let destruction consume this home, save us, keep us, and tend us in *your* care, that renewed in Christ's own body we may perceive your true presence in every earthly thing.

Amen.

WELCOME AND GREETING (sitting)

FIRST READING:

Job 38-40 (selected)

This reading prepares us for our confession of sin and absolution.

A reading from Job.

¹Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind:

²"Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? ³Gird up your loins like a human,

I will question you, and you shall declare to me.

⁴ Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding.

⁵Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it?

⁶On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone

when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy?

²⁵"Who has cut a channel for the torrents of rain, and a way for the thunderbolt, ²⁶to bring rain on a land where no one lives, on the desert, which is empty of human life, ²⁷to satisfy the waste and desolate land, and to make the ground put forth grass?

39"Can you hunt the prey for the lion, or satisfy the appetite of the young lions, 40when they crouch in their dens, or lie in wait in their covert? 4Who provides for the raven its prey, when its young ones cry to God, and wander about for lack of food?

³⁹²¹"Do you know when the mountain goats give birth?
Do you observe the calving of the deer?

²Can you number the months that they fulfill,
and do you know the time when they give birth,

³when they crouch to give birth to their offspring,
and are delivered of their young?

⁴Their young ones become strong, they grow up in the open;
they go forth, and do not return to them.

²⁶"Is it by your wisdom that the hawk soars, and spreads its wings toward the south? ²⁷Is it at your command that the eagle mounts up and makes its nest on high? ²⁸It lives on the rock and makes its home in the fastness of the rocky crag. ²⁹From there it spies the prey; its eyes see it from far away. ³⁰Its young ones suck up blood; and where the slain are, there it is."

40:1And the LORD said to Job:

² "Shall a faultfinder contend with the Almighty?"

Anyone who argues with God must respond."

³Then Job answered the LORD: ⁴"See, I am of small account; what shall I answer you? I lay my hand on my mouth. ⁵I have spoken once, and I will not answer; twice, but will proceed no further."

CONFESSION OF SIN AND ABSOLUTION

Let us confess our sin, in the presence of God and of one another. O God, you know us through and through,

You see and know everything we throw away, discard, and consume, The plastics and the styrofoam, the chemicals and the glass, The bottles and the wrappers, the fumes of burned gas.

O God, you know us through and through,

You see and know the things we do not wish to see, the dead zones expanding in the ocean, the ashes of burned-out forests, the bleached coral reefs, the mountains of trash dumped in countries far away. You see the people, many poorer than us, who lose their safety while these things are still far away from us here.

O God, you know us through and through,

You see and know the comforts and convenience, the ease and peace we choose, the way we have gotten accustomed to having earthly things at our control and command.

O God, you know us through and through,

We confess that although we know our small individual choices alone won't make a difference, and although feelings of guilt and sorrow on their own aren't helpful for bringing about change, that still our own hearts hurt with the destruction of the planet and our part in it.

We confess to you the missed opportunities we have had in our lives to join with others in faithful ways of respecting the planet, its inhabitants, and you, our Creator.

We bring all this in a spirit of openness before you and humbly ask for your mercy for the sake of Jesus Christ our savior.

Silence for meditation. After the sound of the singing bowl, the second reading prepares us to hear the words of absolution.

SECOND READING Romans 8:19-26

A reading from Romans.

¹⁹For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; ²⁰ for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²² We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; ²³ and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in^a hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes^b for what is seen? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

²⁶Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes⁴ with sighs too deep for words.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

INVITATION TO DISCONNECT FROM ARTIFICIAL LIGHT

Our phones, screens, and devices connect us with limitless information and knowledge. They can also themselves be part of the problem.

The endless artificial light, artificially always "turned on," takes us out from the natural cycles of the earth, of rest, and the knowledge that we are limited creatures.

At this time I invite you to turn off any phones or devices that you have with you, and if you so desire, you may place them at the foot of the processional cross.

The words of this worship are a prayer for the interceding power of the Spirit, which in our reading from Romans, intercedes for us, in us, for the whole of creation.

GOSPEL (Standing)

John 20:11-18

The holy gospel according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

"But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; ¹² and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. ¹³They said

to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." ¹⁴When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. ¹⁵Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). ¹⁷Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." ¹⁸Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

FORGIVENESS OF SIN AND ABSOLUTION.

In place of the sermon, we hear the proclamation of God's forgiveness and the power of the gospel.

Almighty God, who is powerful in mercy, saw and loved us even we were dead in our sin, and raises us to life with Christ. By God's infinite grace, the stone of the tomb is rolled away, the spirit of death is cast away, and you set free. In the name of Jesus Christ, + your sins are forgiven.

May God strengthen you with power through the Creator Spirit, fill you with life-breathing peace,

that Christ may live and grow in and through you and all the creation, our garden, wilderness, and home. May the intentions and thoughts of all our hearts be turned through the word of Christ in us to new ways of living and caring.

Lift up your hearts.


We lift them to the Lord.

LORD'S PRAYER


Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us. Our Father in heaven,
