Welcome to United Lutheran Church! We're delighted you've joined us for Easter Sunday worship. If you're new to worship, **parts for everyone to say or sing are bolded**, and parts that the worship leaders will say are unbolded.

Every year the fourth Sunday of Easter attends to the biblical image of Christ the good shepherd. The good shepherd image shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It is the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, that gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. First John illustrates what it means to lay down our lives for one another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sibling in need.



GOSPEL John 10:11-18

The holy gospel according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said:] ¹¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹²The hired hand, who is not the sheep and runs away—and the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

NICENE CREED*

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

^{*}Reciting the ancient creeds together connects the church of each generation to the promises made in baptism and to the earliest followers of Christ. The act of saying the creeds embodies how Christian faith is individual and it is shared across generations. If you are new to worship, or if you haven't been baptized or confirmed, or if you aren't sure at this time if you can mean what you are invited to say, remaining silent is also welcome and permitted.







The risen Christ is made known to us in the breaking of the bread.


Come and eat at God's table.


